UWCA Program Receives \$4.2M Grant to Help Veterans Experiencing Homelessness

After 10 years of operation in the state of Alabama, which has seen homelessness among veterans decrease by 40% in that same time, United Way Priority Veteran has received its largest grant ever from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), totaling \$4,217,748.

The Priority Veteran program is dedicated to helping veterans experiencing homelessness and their families – or those who are at immediate risk of losing their homes locate and secure permanent, affordable housing. Case managers also work with clients to help them apply for benefits that they are eligible for and acquire the skills necessary to

become financially stable. Each year, the primary funder of Priority Veteran is an annual grant from the VA through Supportive Services for Veteran Families. This year's total is almost \$2 million more than the amount awarded last year.

The extra funding will enable Priority Veteran to increase the number of veterans served, services provided and build up the program's staff. Drew Langloh, United Way of Central Alabama's President and CEO, said this funding means more veteran

support is coming.

"In the 10 years that Prioritv Veteran has sought to keep our veterans and their families in homes, we have made significant progress toward that goal," Langloh said. "We are excited to see the increase in service provision and service quality that this increased funding will bring."

Dr. Ladi Kukoyi, CEO/ Executive Director of the Birmingham VA Health Care System, said the strength of the effort to house and keep veterans housed "lies in unity and collaboration."

'Our work at the Birmingham VA Health Care System is significantly enhanced by the support and dedication of partners like Priority Veteran and United Way," Kukoyi said. "These organizations are vital in helping us fulfill our mission of providing necessary housing for veterans and their families who are experiencing hardships, no matter

the cause.' In 2023 alone, Priority Veteran helped 619 military

veterans who were either experiencing homelessness or were at immediate risk of eviction. Of those who completed the program, 90% were able to get back into either temporary or permanent housing.

Lula Skowronek, Director of Priority Veteran, said she appreciates the added support for filling a need which is so prevalent in Alabama and across the country.

"This added funding will enable us to do more for our veterans than ever before," Skowronek said. "I couldn't be more pleased with this opportunity for our staff to make an even greater impact in the lives of a population which is so deserving of our support."

Staffing additions from the new funding include two housing specialists, who will help recruit more landlords who agree to partner with Priority Veteran in helping keep clients housed, as well as an eligibility specialist to help increase the efficiency of the statewide organization.

But she also knew there was a great possibility she could do it. She'd already won two preliminary competitions: evening gown and talent. She'd also won a community service scholarship, too.

Still, she says, you never what direction the judges might go. And she she truly felt any of her fellow pageant sisters would do a great job as the title holder.

"Then it was just me and Addison (Shoemaker) holding hands for the winning spot. That moment was so precious. I just looked at Addison and we were both crying and shaking, and I just looked at her and I said, "It's all in God's plan."

And it was. Mims, who is 16, won the title - the 23rd young woman to receive the crown since the pageant started in 2003.

"The feeling that I just had in my heart was crazy," she recalls. "All I knew to say was, 'Thank you Jesus'. And every video you see, I just looked up at the ceiling and said, 'Thank you Jesus', probably a hundred times, because that's all I knew to say."

Becoming Miss Alabama's Teen was a dream Mims has had since she was two. That's when her mom, who also competed in the Miss Alabama pageant years before, began taking her and her sister to watch.

"I absolutely fell in love. I watched the girls on stage compete, and I actually developed my love for performing and for the organization from watching them," Mims said.

That love was evident Sunday when she performed "O mio babbino caro," a soprano aria from the opera, *Gianni Schicchi*. Ironically, singing was also her mother's talent when she competed. Mims also got a chance to share with judges her social initiative, the Joyful Noise Foundation, which raises money to provide musical instruments in special needs classes. Ultimately, Mims would like to be a music therapist in children's hospitale

dren's hospitals. "I love working with anyone with music, but especially children because the innocence and the joy with them is so much fun," Mims describes energetically. "A lot of people don't know that 76% of schools in Alabama don't offer music education to special needs students. So as Miss Alabama's Teen, my plans will consist of ways to go into schools and travel the state figuring out ways to implement music education so that no special needs

child has to sit there and wonder why they won't

have the music education."

Mims is from Harpersville and is a junior at Chelsea High School. She's a varsity cheerleader, a member of Key Club, Future Teachers of America, Youth Leadership Shelby County and a member of the worship team at her church. Although she's not from Hoover, she says she's been

proud to represent the city. "I firmly believe part of the reason that I won is because I had so many incredible and encouraging people behind me that were willing to help me do whatever it was that I needed to win Miss Alabama's Teen and get that community service scholarship. And so the time that I had as Ms. Hoover's Teen was nothing short of incredible and I'm definitely not giving that up. I'll continue to visit Hoover and do all the things that I'm needed there for."

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Changes in Trash Pickup Days Coming this Month for Some Hoover Residents

Starting Monday, March 25th, over 10-thousand Hoover residents will have new days on which their trash is collected. The changes have been presented to the City by Amwaste, the company that provides waste collection for multiple Jefferson County municipalities, including Hoover.

Under the new plan, Amwaste would eliminate Wednesday and Saturday collections, placing those customers on either a Monday/Thursday pickup route or a Tuesday/Friday route.

"Amwaste's plan that has twenty routes running on all four of those weekdays with twenty separate trucks gives us a higher level of assurance that they can make the service level improve and be more consistent," says Hoover City Administrator Ken Grimes.

"By having four weekday pickups for all citizens, it gives the contractor two days to catch up on any given week based on problems they may encounter such as a truck out of service or staffing due to employee needs."

With the new proposal, Interstate 459 will serve as the dividing line for routes. Homes south of I-459 will be serviced on Mondays and Thursdays; homes north of the interstate will be picked up on Tuesdays and Fridays.

"Knowing that should also help us with a clear line of delineation in dealing with route managers and any unfortunate missed services that come to our attention period."

Recycling will remain

on the second service day.

Grimes stresses the importance of residents continuing to use My Hoover Connect to report missed pickups and other problems they may encounter. Residents can do so by:

Alabama Introduces CHOOSE Act: Tax Credits for Education

Alabama has taken a significant step forward in education reform with the introduction of the Creating Hope and Opportunity for Our Students' Education (CHOOSE) Tax Credit program. Enacted through legislation (L. 2024, H129 (Act 21)), effective March 7, 2024, this program aims to alleviate the financial burden of educational expenses for parents while enhancing access to quality education for students across the state.

The CHOOSE Act establishes a refundable income tax credit system, administered by the Department of Revenue, targeted at parents of eligible students. These tax credits are designed to offset the costs of qualifying educational expenses incurred by families. Under the program, the Department of Revenue will create education savings accounts (ESAs) where credit funds will be deposited for participating parents to utilize towards educational services.

Eligibility for the CHOOSE Act tax credit is determined based on family income levels. Initially, for the years beginning in 2025 and 2026, the credit will be accessible to parents with adjusted gross incomes not exceeding 300% of the federal poverty level for the preceding tax year. However, from January 1, 2027, onward, the credit will be available to all parents of eligible students.

Special consideration is given to special-needs students, with the first 500 tax credits reserved for their parents. The amount of the credit varies depending on whether the student is enrolled in a participating school or not, capped at either \$7,000 or \$2,000 annually, respectively.

Importantly, the received credit amounts will not be considered taxable income for parents or students, and they are exempt from offset or debt collection against any liability.

Key definitions under the program include the term "eligible student," encompassing children aged five to 19 years residing in Alabama who have not graduated high school or aged five to 21 years who qualify for services under specific education acts. However, certain exclusions apply, such as students receiving funds under the Alabama Accountability Act or those not lawfully present in the United States.

"Qualifying educational expenses" cover a broad spectrum, including tuition, textbooks, tutoring, online learning programs, educational software, and more.


The administration of the program involves the Department of Revenue creating ap-

plication processes for both parents and participating schools or education service providers. The Department also oversees the distribution of tax credits, the establishment of ESAs, and the dissemination of relevant information to stakeholders.

To ensure the sustainability of the program, the legislation establishes the CHOOSE Act Fund, allocating a minimum of \$100 million annually beginning in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to support the tax credits.

Additionally, the Department will provide transparent program information on its website, including details on credits claimed and approved participating entities.

The CHOOSE Act represents a significant investment in the educational future of Alabama's students, aiming to empower families with greater choice and opportunity in their children's education.

AFVGA Conference Highlights Greatness on the Gulf

The Alabama Fruit & Vegetable Growers Association's (AFVGA) annual conference and trade show brought almost 300 specialty crop farmers and industry leaders to Gulf Shores Feb. 14-16.

One of those was AFVGA board member Craig Goolsby of Silverhill Satsumas.

"I am not a traditional farmer," said Goolsby of Baldwin County. "I am a second career farmer. AFVGA pushes me to interface with folks who have more experience in agriculture. It provides guidance and lets me know I'm not alone."

One area of focus for Goolsby is marketing his

"This industry is a lot different than most areas of farming," said Goolsby, a member of Sweet Grown Alabama. "Someone who deals with fruits and vegetables is not only a grower but a marketer of their own produce. The conference allowed me to meet business owners who are looking for products to sell in their storefronts.'

Attendees met Sweet Grown Alabama Director Ellie Watson at the organization's interactive exhibit. Watson dove into the logistics of the state's agricultural branding program during the luncheon Day 2.

"We are here to help farmers sell their products to consumers," WatAFVGA have been with us since the beginning in 2019. We will continue to serve our producers and welcome new members to join.

Along with Sweet Grown Alabama, 30 other vendors greeted guests during the trade show sponsored by Bejo Seeds, a global fruit and vegetable seed company.

"We love getting to visit with the growers," said Dylan Teel of Bejo Seeds. "We network with other industry members, too. The conference helps expose all of us to what's out there."

Teel, an Alabama native, received the AFVGA scholarship in 2019 while studying horticulture at Auburn University (AU).

"This is one of our favorite shows because it's down home," Teel said. "There are good grower contacts and impressive breakout sessions.'

Those educational sessions were centered around vegetable production; orchard fruit and nuts; small fruit: and marketing and farm management.

Farm tours and workshops were on the agenda, too. The group visited Wildfork Blueberries in Brewton and the Gulf Coast Research & Extension Center in Fairhope for equipment demonstrations before arriving at The Lodge at Gulf State Park Feb. 14.

"I visited Wildfork Blueberries to get a firsthand look at their packing

son said. "Our friends at facility," Goolsby said. presented the scholarship "Once our crop comes out of the ground or off the tree, it needs to be processed. These takeaways will help when we open our own packing house."

More hands-on learning took place during produce safety training with Alabama Department of Agriculture & Industries. Other workshops focused on hydronics and protected agriculture; agricultural labor; variety trial research; and flowers.

"The American-grown cut-flowers movement has increased the last few years," said AFVGA Executive Director Blake Thaxton. "We believe that farms have opportunities to create markets in the cut-flower industry. This workshop was a great introduction to the crop."

The fun continued during a family luau overlooking the Gulf of Mexico. Special entertainment from duo Wylie Pete created a relaxed atmosphere as families placed bids at the silent auction, a new addition to the conference.

The AFVGA board of directors pushed to incorporate the auction to fund the Jimmy Witt Memorial Scholarship. Generous farmers raised over \$2,000.

"Jimmy was an integral member of AFVGA," Thaxton said. "Since his passing, we strive to honor his legacy by giving back to young people pursuing careers in agriculture."

Bobby Boozer of Boozer Farms in Chilton County was also recognized. Boozer received the AFVGA Exceptional Award for outstanding involvement with the association and industry.

"Since joining the state's largest farm organization, we have moved in the right direction," Powell said. "We see a good mix of ages in our crowd. That's what we need to keep growing."

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
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

what Easter is all about. They thought He was **dead (28:1).** The women who had lingered at the Cross came early to the tomb, bringing spices that they might anoint His body. They thought He was dead. In fact, they wondered how they would move the huge stone that blocked the entrance to the tomb (Mark 16:3). It is remarkable that they did not believe in His Resurrection when He had taught this truth repeatedly (Matthew 16:21; 17:23;

20:19; 26:32). We must never underestimate the importance of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The world believes that Jesus died, but many in the world do not believe that Jesus rose from the dead. Peter's message at Pentecost emphasizes the Resurrection. The emphasis on the Resurrection is not just in Peter's message, but also throughout the book of Acts. What is the significance of the Resurrection for us today?

It proves that Jesus is God's Son. Jesus stated that He had authority to lay down His life and to take it up again (John 10:17-18).

It verifies the truth of **Scripture.** Both in the Old Testament and in the New Testament teaching of Jesus, His Resurrection is clearly taught (Psalm 16:10; 110:1). If Jesus had not come out of the tomb, then these Scriptures would not be true.

It assures our own future Resurrection. Because Jesus died and rose again, we shall one day be raised to be like Him (1 4:13-18). The entire structure of the Christian faith rests upon
